Our fellow member, Kim Harms, has been instrumental in providing financial resources to establish a loan program for dentists in Rwanda to set up their own private practice with the benefits of a non-profit status through the organization, Oral Health Foundation Rwanda. Kim will be present at our Annual Meeting in April to share the details of the project. The first loan has been granted!

Rwanda has several dental clinics set up around the country. One established clinic in the southern area serves 350,000 people. Care is drastically limited due to a shortage of handpieces.

ICD-MN would like to collect any instruments, extraction forceps, and working handpieces (high and slow speed) that you are not using and would like to donate to a very worthwhile cause. The Oral Health Foundation of Rwanda will provide a receipt for tax purposes for your donation.
